
SECRETARY, WEST VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, WEST VIRGINIA DEVELOPMENT OFFICE

In December 2010, Keith Burdette was appointed by Governor Earl Ray Tomblin as Cabinet Secretary for the West Virginia Department of Commerce and Executive Director of the West Virginia Development Office. In addition to the West Virginia Development Office, the Department of Commerce includes WorkForce West Virginia, the Division of Natural Resources, Tourism, Energy, Labor, Forestry, Miners' Health, Safety and Training, Geological and Economic Survey and the Office of Economic Opportunity.

Keith Burdette began his public service when he was elected to the first of two terms in the West Virginia House of Delegates at age 23. In 1982 he was elected to the West Virginia State Senate and in 1989 Keith was elected the 42nd President of the State Senate at the age of 34, the youngest Senate President in the state's history.

In 2000 Governor Bob Wise asked Keith to join his administration where he served as Director of Policy and Legislative Relations until 2003.

While out of state government, Keith formed the Burdette Group, a consulting firm focused on government relations and economic development. He managed and operated the Wood County Development Authority, and served as President of the Area Roundtable. He was a member of the first board of governors for West Virginia University-Parkersburg, and served on the board of directors of the Mid-Ohio Valley Regional Council as well as the regional Workforce Investment Board. He was chairman of the board of the Parkersburg Art Center and served on the Erickson All-Sports board of directors.



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Keith has been recognized by many organizations for his service, including receiving an honorary doctorate from West Virginia University-Parkersburg; being named the Outstanding Young West Virginian by the West Virginia Jaycees; and being named one of the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce's Ten Outstanding Young Americans. He has received a Distinguished West Virginian Award from both Governor's Gaston Caperton and Bob Wise.

In addition to serving in Governor Tomblin's executive cabinet, Keith is chairman of the West Virginia Economic Development Authority, chairman of the Jobs Investment Trust board of directors, and serves on the board of the West Virginia Children's Home Society, Vision Shared, West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education, and Tech Connect West Virginia.

Keith is married to the former Pat Haught Huffman and has two sons and two step sons.
