

May 11th, 2013 marked the third annual commencement ceremony for Eastern WVCTC.







Eastern WVCTC attended the Annual Hardy County Chamber dinner. Two Eastern students accompanied Eastern employees in order to network the event.






Students participated in several activities and games throughout the year including the Constitution Bowl, HLC Jeapordy, and Pizza with the President.
