Health Assessment is a 16 week course that focuses on the biopsychosocial assessment across the life-span as compared to normal parameters. The course includes performing a comprehensive systems assessment and obtaining health histories. As part of the nursing curriculum, the course explores development, communication skills, interviewing and critical thinking in assessing the client so holistic care can be provided in the health care setting. The course had a laboratory component in which the students were taught how to obtain vital signs, use therapeutic communication to obtain a health history and how to utilize equipment and obtain a head to toe physical.

Each student had to obtain a comprehensive health history and perform a head to toe physical on a classmate which was worth 150 points of their final grade. In addition, the students were given written tests to equal 283 points.
