<b>Catalog Description:</b> This course is designed as an introduction to visual art terminology, analysis, and practices through an art history survey of traditional Appalachian arts. It is designed to give a background of visual literacy using the traditional arts of Appalachia. Students will also gain an appreciation for the creativity, problem solving, and originality that developed in the Appalachian region, specifically within the arts and crafts created by Appalachian artists.
<b>Course Outcomes:</b> Students will be able to – 1. Demonstrate an understanding of the principles and elements of design. 2. Demonstrate the use of art terminology. 3. Identify the Appalachian Region and many of the cultural elements that define it. 4. Identify and understand the use of tools, techniques and supplies used within each unit with specific attention to use of native Appalachian materials. 5. Identify the relationship of the arts to the history and culture of Appalachia. 6. Analyze and criticize artwork by communicating a variety of ideas, feelings, opinions and judgments based on the artist's intent, meaning, and purpose. 7. Explain the role of art in everyday life, especially Appalachian life.
