

1. Call to Order – The meeting was called to order at 12:00pm by R. Tissue. Since R. Tissue was joining the meeting remotely, he passed leadership of the meeting to Vice Chair G. Greenwalt. Present were Dr. Terrell, R. Tissue (via Zoom), G. Greenwalt, M. Chambers, S. Staley, C. Hakala, A. Degnan, and T. May. Absent were G. Sponaugle, D. Bean, Jr Helmick, and F. Shanholtz.

2. *Action Items:

a. Approval of the Minutes – Meeting of February 21, 2018

On a Chambers/Tissue motion, the minutes were approved with all in favor.

b. Approval of Fees for FY19

Fee increases need to be approved at the state level only if all students are affected. The fees discussed pertain only to nursing students, so no state approval is necessary. The proposed fee increases are:

Nursing Course Related Fee NU 133, NU 134, NU 144, NU 234, NU244 from \$25.00 to \$35.00

Nursing HESI Fee from \$125.25 to \$150.00

Nursing NCLEX Review Fee from \$355.00 to \$400.00

On a Chambers/May motion, the increased nursing fees were approved with all in favor.

- b. Classified Staff update Ann Degnan A. Degnan reported that the next Classified Staff meeting is on June 19, 2018; pay raises are being applied differently at different institutions; and Chancellor Hill plans to retire.
- c. Faculty update Curtis Hakala C. Hakala reported that the IDEA student survey tool has been distributed to faculty for feedback. A first aid and mental health training for faculty is coming up; Open House at the Tech Center is on April 14, 2018; evening classes for fall 2018 are being increased; and summer and fall class registration begins on April 2, 2018.
- d. Student update Theda May T. May reported that SGA elections are approaching, as is the SGA-sponsored blood drive.
- 4. Strategic Plan 2015 2020 Reports Dr. Charles Terrell
 - a. Legislative Session
 - i. Community College bill The community college bill has been tabled, but may be revisited by legislators in September during supplemental appropriations meetings.
 - ii. Appropriations K. Williams has developed two budget scenarios, one based on 175 FTE's and one based on 200 FTE's. Both scenarios result in a deficit. While in Charleston, Dr. Terrell met with legislators. Chancellor Tucker, and the Vice-Chair of WVHEPC. Dr. Terrell requested of all of them a state-level sustainable funding model. Dr. Terrell and R. Tissue had a conference call with Chancellor Tucker and Bob Brown of HEPC, and learned that the Chancellor is trying to schedule a meeting with Chief of Staff Mike Hall to get the funding issue on the table. A \$500,000.00 supplemental appropriation would only be a Band-Aid, and a \$3 million funding base is needed. R. Tissue indicated that, if the supplemental appropriation is successful, it is possible that the Chancellor and Bob Brown could approach Eastern asking for a back-up plan for FY 20. The Board of Governors need to discuss this issue at their April 2018 meeting, and plan a meeting to include Board of Governors members and legislators to reinforce the necessity of having a community college in Eastern's service region. Dr. Terrell reported that he had make a hard push in February and March while in Charleston hoping to have some resolution prior to the HLC visit in April. Eastern's CFI will be of concern to the HLC visiting team, but state appropriations are beyond the control of the College. Dr. Terrell and R. Tissue will both attend the Council and System meetings in Charleston next month.

- iii. Potomac Highlands Reinvestment Fund proposal Dr. Terrell reported that he is working with the WV Development Office to propose that Eastern's annual \$66,000 loan repayment be reinvested in Potomac Highlands economic development initiatives. The proposal received positive feedback, and a meeting to further discuss the proposal will soon be scheduled.
