Staff-Ann Degnan –

- 1. The state is initiating a common course numbering system in the Community College system through a transfer agreement to solidify the transfer process.
- 2. Modifying the term Skill Set to Micro-credential in the catalog, all Eastern documents and in DegreeWorks. Micro-credential is an electronic badging system that links course content, mini-courses, WF non-credit courses, and focus skills to certifying students as career and job ready.
- 3. Faculty is recognizing and recording at risk students for the spring semester in the Early Alert spreadsheet for early intervention measures.
- 4. CIS 114, Introduction to Computer Applications and Concepts, is transitioning to an exclusive online forum because of decreased enrollment in live sections, this trend is prevalent with General Education courses with online enrollment substantially increasing.
- 5. The Assessment Committee has proposed the following General Education strands:
 - 1. Written Communication
 - 2. Oral Communication

Ultrasound Technician

I met with Vicki Hott, a retired radiologist who lives in Moorfield and is interested in helping us start an Ultrasound Technician Program. We had a great meeting and subsequently I contacted WVU Hospital who reached out to me in the past and I have set up a meeting with WVU to discuss specifics of such a program and how they may be able to help us with the program.

Panthera

We investigated and made a proposal to the owner of Panthera to utilize their facility for CDL instruction. The owner rejected our proposal so at this point we will be continuing to teach CDL at the Tech Center and the overlook.

Chancellor's Office:

The Chancellor's Office has hired an additional assistant director of financial aid to support some of the schools (Eastern is one of them) at no additional cost. They are working out the details on how this new position may help us better provide financial aid services at the College.

There was an emergency legislative meeting called on Monday by the Chancellor and she met with all of the presidents via Zoom. The meeting dealt with Bluefield University requesting the

legislature to allow them to offer associate degree programs. This is causing significant concern among the community college system. It seems like it will pass the senate but the hope is that the bill gets killed in the House.

Strategic Plan Tracking:

On January 23rd, I met with the Strategic Planning and Effectiveness Committee (SPEC). We went through the Strategic Plan goals, objectives and targets and made notations of progress to date. The goal will be to meet at least once per semester and track progress, as well as track progress of other College plans to ensure that the College is being effective on all levels of planning. I will present progress updates to the Board at least once per semester so that the Board is aware of how we are progressing.

Valley View Golf Course:

I met by Zoom with Donna Alexander from the Valley View Golf Course and we will be visiting the course and the historic building onsite in a few weeks. She wants to see how we might be able to partner in terms of hospitality. We have submitted a hospitality grant to the state to help us start a hospitality program at the college. They could be a potential partner.

HLC Accreditation:

We are continuing to have team meetings for the HLC re-accreditation process for Eastern. L. Guinn has started to draft the Assurance Argument based on information provided by the different teams. We are trying to identify potential concerns and address them the best we can. In my review, there are things that the College should have had established and may have but somethings have floated.

Northrop Grumman:

We are planning a visit to Northrop Grumman on Wednesday, Feb 22 to see how we might be able to address some of their workforce needs.

AMT Program:

I submitted the Arise concept paper to ARC and received positive feedback. I believe we will be given the green light to apply for a planning grant. I hope to hear back from ARC within a month or so. I am planning a visit in March to Pierpont to discuss planning steps for the program should we get to apply. Also, on April 13th Pierpont is having an aviation career day with several aviation companies present. I plan to attend that event.
