Additionally, four hands-on projects related to Microsoft Word, Excel, Access, and PowerPoint were given to students to assess the practical aspects of the course.

The performance target for this assessment was set at 75%. The average score for the five outcomes was 86.1% with two outlier scores of 20% and 35% (Two students randomly answered selected questions).

A performance range of 5% was assigned to all outcomes to identify the outcomes that are 5% below or above the performance target score of 75%.

Notes from the last assessment:

"All eleven outcomes of this course will be assessed again in spring of 2016. The on-line section of this as well as the face-to-face section will be included in the assessment."

Last year, the faculty reduced the number of outcomes to streamline the assessment process. This assessment evaluates five of the nine outcomes.

The college has not offered this course in on-line format. Offering this course in on-line format would reduce the enrollment in face-to-face classes and may result to the cancellation of the some face-to-face sections. To make sure this course is available to all students several sections of day-time and one section of evening time are offered every semester.

Based on the assessment results, the performance of students in Presentation Software, Word Processing Software, Database Management Software and Spreadsheet Software has improved by more than 10% since the last time this course was assessed. See the accompanying Chart.



The assessment of this hands-on course can improve if the homework assignments are also included in the assessment.

Note from the last assessment

"In spring of 2016 additional assessment tools will be used to evaluate all the outcomes." Last assessment report focused on multiple choice questions, while this assessment report has included hands-on project in addition to multiple choice questions.

In addition to the three sections of CIS 114 which are assessed in this report, two more sections were taught during fall 2017 which are not included in this report.

One of the sections was taught at an off-campus location. Many of the students who took the off-campus section needed significant help since they had not used computers before. The instructor teaching the course could only cover very basic concepts of Word, Excel, Access and PowerPoint to make sure that the students could keep up with the assignments. If the college plans to offer a computer course again for this off-campus location or similar audiences, it is highly recommended that a very basic, special-topic hands-on course in Introductory Computers be offered to this location, or similar audiences. Considering that the instructor couldn't cover all the course materials, it is assumed that the targeted outcomes for this section were not met.

Attendance in CIS 114 is very important and has direct impact in students' performance. To improve the attendance, the syllabus of the course was revised, the percentage of the final grade for in-class assignments increased from 10% to 30% and students were made aware of this change.

This spring semester the college is offering a hybrid section of this course in the main campus as a pilot project. The informative videos and articles that are posted on this site will be shared with the other face-to-face sections to provide students with additional instructional materials.

One of the outcomes of the course refers to library resources. This outcome was covered briefly in fall of 2017. The students can benefit if more lecture time is assigned to this outcome.
