**Catalog Description:** This course provides an introduction to the health needs and concerns of the pre-school age child. This course covers the health issues and safety concerns as well as the proper nutrition for a growing and developing child. These three areas will be applied to personality development, to the social promotion of the child's self-esteem and well-being, and the physical development that takes place.

## **Expanded Course Description:**

This course provides an introduction to health and safety requirements and responsibilities for individuals working in early childhood programs. Health, nutrition, and safety policies, procedures, and practices are studied. Students will meet state health and safety requirements for child care employees.

Students will learn how to design developmentally appropriate activities to teach young children about health and safety behaviors and to assume responsibility for their own well-being.

Lectures, class participation, class discussion, and observation will be the main instructional procedures for this course. Students will also be expected to acquire all necessary documentation required for employment in an early childhood program. Key Assessments will include:
