This course was taught as an independent study. Students were required to meet four times during the semester with their instructor. Assignments included writing a resume, becoming a member of the edWeb community and critiquing three webinars, and completing a research project. During the class meetings, further explanation was given toward assignments as needed, and progress of completing assignments was reported to the instructor by the student.

Course Role in the Curriculum

This course serves as the final Early Childhood course taken before graduation for Early Childhood majors. The research project serves as a reflection on what students have learned in the Early Childhood Program. The resume is written to help address the students' employment goals in Early Childhood.

The resume assignment was given, and students were free to use any format.

The rubric for a grade of A used to assess the resume included:

Students should include their personal information, which included all contact information, Students should include their formal education,

Students should include all work experience,

Students should include a list of three references, as a separate page, at the end of the resume, Students should use correct usage and spelling on all parts of the resume.

The edWeb assignment included joining edWeb and viewing three webinars. The rubric for a grade of A used to assess the edWeb assignment included:

Students needed to join edWeb and create their own edWeb page,

Students needed to view three edWeb webinars and print certificates to verify their attendance of the webinar,

Students needed to critique each webinar with a two paragraph response,

Students' paragraphs needed to include five complete sentences with correct usage and spelling, Students needed to summarize the main points from the webinar in their first paragraph,

Students needed to respond to the main points from the webinar by relating the information to their future career path in Early Childhood in the second paragraph,

Students needed to explain how they could use this information to grow in their careers. Students were assigned to complete a research project. The rubric for earning a grade of A included: Students were to select a topic of their choice in regard to Early Childhood and get this topic approved by their third meeting with the instructor during the semester,

Students were to research their topic in Early Childhood by finding seven different sources, Students were to write a research paper on their topics that included an introduction, a body of their paper, a summary section, and a works cited page,

Students were to use correct usage and spelling throughout the paper and works cited page, Students were to create a power point presentation that included seven slides,

Students were to use correct usage and spelling on their power point slides,

Students were to present their power point presentation to their instructor during their last meeting of the semester.
