Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College Courses for Juniors and Seniors.

ART 100 Art Appreciation

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

Demonstrates the significance of art in everyday life through study of the works of various artists.

ENL 101 English Composition I

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

Prerequisite: Minimum acceptable test scores for placement in college-level English.

An introduction to basic composition. The major thrust is directed toward achieving competency in writing a composition. ENL 101 introduces students to the practice of writing with emphasis on the writing process, thesis development, context, purpose, and audience.

HIT 240 American History I – 1492-1877

Tuition \$120.00* 3 semester hours

An interpretive study of the cultural, diplomatic, political, environmental, and social history of the colonial, federal, and Civil War eras. Emphasis will be placed on significant ideas and personalities.

MTH 135 College Algebra

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

Prerequisite: (Math ACT score 21 or higher; SAT math score 330 or higher; or Accuplacer 260 or higher on the QR/Algebra/Stats)

College Algebra covers the following topics: systems of equations, theory and application of matrices, theory of equations and inequalities, complex numbers, graphs of relations and functions, theory and application of exponential and logarithmic functions, and mathematical modeling of data. Will need a **graphic calculator and myMath lab access** for the online assignment.

POL 201 American Government and Politics

Tuition \$120.00* 3 semester hours

This course examines the United States federal government system with emphasis on the constitution, government structure, and the political process.

PSY 200 General Psychology

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

Introduces the principles and methods of the scientific study of human behavior.

SOC 203 Intro to Sociology

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

This course is an introduction to the scientific study of society in which emphasis is placed on examining groups and the impact of groups on individual behavior and attitudes.

SSC 147 Understanding Human Diversity

Tuition \$120.00* 3 Semester Hours

Prerequisite: minimum acceptable test scores for placement in college-level English

This course examines issues surrounding human diversity, understanding and appreciating differences, and exploring the impact that students' values and attitudes have on their interactions with individuals from various groups as distinguished by race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, social classes, religion, and subculture.

IS EARLY ENTRANCE COLLEGE-CREDIT TRANSFERABLE?

All college-level courses earned are transferable to other West Virginia colleges and universities and to most other institutions of higher education throughout the nation. Occasionally, an out-of-state university will not accept Early Entrance credits; if you know where you will be attending, we suggest that you check with the appropriate college official now to determine transferability.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- The high school principal or counselor must approve the registration of students.
- Parents/guardians must complete the Course Authorization & Responsibility Form
- The College must approve the student for admission of the course(s).
- Course prerequisites must be met. (for English, Math, Biology, and some business classes)
 - Score requirements are listed in the College Catalog.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO TAKE A CLASS?

(Subject to Revision)

Tuition for college classes taught to early entrance students will be \$40.00 per credit hour which means it will be \$120.00 per 3-credit course. There is a \$15.00 lab fee for Biology/Chemistry/General Science. Medical Terminology has a \$10.00 Allied Health Fee

WHEN IS TUITION DUE?

Tuition is due by the first day of class. For the Fall semester, deadline for payment is August 23, 2021, or the FIRST day of your high school classes whichever comes first.

Starting Fall 2020, students must login to MyEastern (student account) to view tuition charges. Bills will NOT be sent.

The Early Entrance add/drop period is within the FIRST week of your high school's first day of attendance. If you want to withdraw from a college class, you must notify your high school counselor and the college for correct withdraw procedure.



Accreditation

In October 2008, Eastern WV Community and Technical College received formal accreditation from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA) as an independent, freestanding community and technical college. Following a HLC team visit to Eastern, HLC reaffirmed the accreditation in February 2014 and April 2018.
