For this agreement:

- \*SOC 230: A Sociological View of Appalachian Culture transfers in as an open elective. it will be substituted for the Minority Content Course requirement.
- \*\* Student will need to plan to take SOWK 151 online at WVU-Online to complete the course work.
  - If the student wishes to matriculate into the on-campus program, they can complete [this application](#) and then enroll in the online course with a 900-level section.
  - If the student wishes to matriculate into the online program, they can complete [this application](#) and then enroll in the online course with a 700-level section.

Students must have completed SOWK 147 (SSC 147) and SOWK 151 (WVU – Online) with a C- or higher and have a 2.0 GPA or higher. Students are required to complete 50-hours of service hours prior to completing the application. This should be done in coordination with the WVU SOWK department.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Students who have questions regarding this articulation agreement, or the transferability of coursework may contact the WVU Office of the University Registrar. All other questions should be directed to the WVU Office of Admissions.

Transfer students, including 2+2 students, who wish to enter the social work major must contact WVU's Office of Admissions and the B.S.W. Program Coordinator no later than the semester before you intend to matriculate to WVU. For entry to the B.S.W. program, students must meet all requirements that apply to major status. Students, who plan to matriculate to WVU in the fall semester at the professional social work major level should contact WVU's Office of Admissions the prior December and complete the application to the B.S.W. program for admission at the professional social work major level in January. 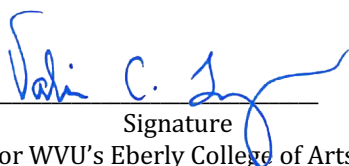
Upper-division social work courses taken at other institutions do not automatically transfer to WVU and meet the program's requirements. To gain approval for these courses students must have earned a B or higher in the course(s) and must submit course syllabi and other appropriate course materials to Dr. Megan Gandy the B.S.W. program director. Courses that are not approved count as electives. The lower-division social work courses taught on 2+2 campuses have received approval via the formal agreement with the program.

The above transfer articulation of credit between West Virginia University and Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College is approved by the Dean, or the Dean's designee, and effective the date of the signature.
