Catalog Description: A basic study of the New Testament. Covers its formation, date of writing, authorship, historical background and the general content of each New Testament book. This course includes the life and teachings of Jesus, and the relationship of the New Testament to the Old Testament and to modern society.

- 2. Discuss the process by which a book became a part of the Christian canon.
- 3. Analyze the influence of the Greco-Roman world on early Christianity.
- 4. Contrast the Greco-Roman Jewish sects.
- 5. Define gospels as ancient biographies and the difference between synoptic and non-synoptic gospels.
- 6. Compare and contrast the figure of Jesus in each of the four canonical gospels.
- 7. Analyze the importance of the Acts of the Apostles in early Christian literature.
- 8. Summarize the different roles of the non-canonical gospels in our understanding of early Christian tradition.
- 9. Contrast the historical Jesus with the Christ.
- 10. Trace the historicity of the New Testament with other extracanonical sources.
- 11. Discuss the Apocalyptic Jesus within early New Testament era tradition.
- 12. Analyze the message of Paul and how it compares and contrasts with the message of Jesus.
- 13. Explain the difference between Paul and pseudo-Paul and define "Pauline Christianities."
- 14. Discuss the status of women in the early church.
- 15. Analyze the relationship between both the early Christians and Greco-Roman Jews and between early Christian sects.
