Catalog Description:
The Nursing Assistant course is organized around eight basic concepts of needs:
comfort, oxygen, nutrition, elimination, communication, psycho-social, teaching, learning
& safety. The nursing assistant process is introduced as a basis for all nursing assistant
practice.
Basic concepts of nursing assistants care as well as developmental needs of the elderly
are incorporated. Selected content focus on basic health needs of patients. This course
includes a survey of nursing assistant history and selected ethical, legal and mental health
concepts. Skills common to the care of hospitalized and nursing home adults are
developed through guided laboratory experience in the laboratory and in the community
health care agency.

Upon successful completion of both the written and practical examinations, students will be eligible to take the certification exam from the State of West Virginia. Certified nurse assistants may find employment opportunities in acute, long term care, and home health agencies.

Course Outcomes:

- 1. Utilize the conceptual framework to identify basic patient needs
- 2. Perform basic clinical assessment related to patient needs according to criteria identified under each nursing assistant concept
- 3. With guidance, implement a plan of care for selected patients
- 4. Perform selected technical skills according to scientific principals
- 5. Demonstrate behavior appropriate for a member within the discipline of nursing
- 6. Select and demonstrate ethical behavior
- 7. Describe rules for effective communication with clients, peers and members of the health team
- 8. Discuss the appropriate role of the Nursing Assistant in the event of emergency, including client falls or injuries, signs of distress, cardiac or respiratory arrest, fire, internal and external disaster
- 9. Select foods in the basic food groups
- 10. Describe appropriate steps in client admission, transfer and discharge
- 11. Formulate a plan to prevent complications in the bed rest client
