*Student EDE 100 - Intro to Elementary Education Fee: Robert Eagle presented an overview of the fee and purpose. All six counties in Eastern's service district have signed on to allow EWVCTC - Ed. Students to observe.

*Student Fee for ATT 103: Ward Malcolm presented an overview of the ATT103 program which will lower cost of textbook and will allow Eastern to purchase books and keep the same edition.

*Student Technology Fee: Ron Hamilton presented the technology fee and discussed the critical state of operation should equipment "go down". The purpose of this fee is to create funds which will be used to replace equipment. Technology replacement plan is being prepared.
