

Frequently Asked Questions



1. When/how will I know if I got into the nursing program?

Acceptance or denial letters will be sent out via email once nursing application scores have been finalized by staff. Please be looking for an email from signNow within 2 weeks after nursing application closes.

2. What certifications are accepted in section III on the nursing score sheet for extra points?

CNA, EMT, Paramedic, LPN, CMA, CCMA, phlebotomy. Certificates/licenses must be current and up to date to be counted for points

3. What information should I send after applying to the nursing program?

4. What scholarships are available for nursing students?

5. How do I register for the ATI TEAS pre-entrance exam?

6. What can I do to increase the likelihood of getting into the nursing program?

- Take the following courses: Human Anatomy and Physiology I and Lab, Human Anatomy and Physiology II and Lab, College English, Psychology, Drug Dosage and Calculations, and General Elective. PRIOR to Application Deadline
- Have a high school GPA of 3.5 or greater
- An accredited college degree
- Allied health or healthcare related certifications/licenses
- Served in the military with honorable discharge
- Score high on the TEAS pre-entrance exam

7. What is the maximum number of students accepted into the program?

30 students are accepted into the nursing cohort and a new cohort will be accepted every 2 years on even years.

8. How many days of the week will I be required to attend class and clinicals?

Classes and clinical sessions will primarily take place from Monday to Thursday, with schedules varying each semester. However, this program requires a full-time commitment, and you may occasionally need to attend classes or clinical sessions on Fridays, Saturdays, or Sundays.

9. When will the nursing applications be available to apply?

Nursing applications are available the November prior to the start of a new cohort in the odd number year.
